Report: Polling in Seven Key States Shows Americans Are Supportive of the January 6th Investigation, Concerned About its Findings, and Want Accountability

Over the course of the past two months, the House Select Committee on January 6th presented its findings from a year-long investigation into the weeks leading up to the election in 2020, the days leading up to January 6th, and what happened during the attack on our country. The hearings have succeeded in laying out evidence that shows there was a violent criminal conspiracy to overturn the results of an election, helmed by Donald Trump and his Republican allies.

This summer, Defend Democracy Project and Public Policy Polling conducted polls across seven states to gauge the public's reactions to the January 6th investigation. These polls show people across the country believe that Trump and MAGA Republicans are responsible for a conspiracy to overturn the will of the people.

Across all seven states polled, voters demonstrated they were concerned about the attack on January 6th and that they hold Trump and Republicans, not just Trump, responsible for the attack.

The polls also showed:

- Over half of voters support the investigation being done by the committee and believe it's important to protect democracy.
- Over half of respondents want to see those responsible held accountable or prosecuted.
- Over 60% of voters are concerned with Trump and his allies telling people there was voter fraud after repeatedly being told there was none.
- Over 60% are concerned with Trump threatening then-Vice President Pence to overturn the election, with a majority of independents being at least somewhat concerned.
- In these states, a majority or near-majority of voters believe what happened on January 6th and the effort to overturn elections is a problem with members of the Republican party as a whole, not just Donald Trump.
- And in Wisconsin, a plurality of voters believe Republicans are more violent than Democrats.

Polling across [Wisconsin](#), [North Carolina](#), [Nevada](#), [Georgia](#), [Arizona](#), [Michigan](#), and [Pennsylvania](#) was remarkably consistent. Americans clearly see the need to prevent MAGA Republicans from being able to hold office in order to enact their agenda to take away our fundamental rights, including the right to pick who leads us. Voters want and deserve accountability in order to stop the ongoing threat to democracy posed by MAGA Republicans across the country.

Subject: Strong Support for January 6th Investigation Among Arizona Voters; Arizonans See Trump Loyalists as the Problem, Not Just Trump

Date: August 10, 2022

A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that a large majority (83%) of Arizona voters have seen, heard, or read a lot or some about the investigation into what happened on January 6th at the U.S. Capitol, and the events leading up to it. Arizonans support the investigation by an 18-point margin (57-39) and a majority (64%) consider the investigation into what happened on January 6th to be important. Among independents, a majority supports the investigation (60-37%) and 68% consider it important.

When considering concerns about the events, over half (56%) of voters think the problem was not only with Donald Trump, but also members of the Republican Party who are loyalists to Trump. Just 7% of voters consider Trump to be the only problem. This is also true among independent voters—52% think the problem is also with Trump loyalists in the Republican Party, while just 9% think the problem is only with Trump.

Voters also express major concerns over issues uncovered by the January 6th investigation:

- 69% are concerned (with 56% very concerned) about Trump and his allies telling people there was voter fraud in the 2020 election, even after some of Trump's lawyers and the Attorney General told them there was no widespread fraud.
- 67% are concerned (with 59% saying they have very serious concerns, including 61% of independents) about Trump demanding that Mike Pence overturn the election result for him even after White House lawyers told him it was illegal.
- 64% are concerned (with 58% very concerned) about Trump knowing that many of his supporters attending his rally on January 6th were armed, yet he instructed them to march on the Capitol anyway. Even 66% of independents are concerned.
- 64% are concerned (with 56% very concerned) about Trump and his team repeatedly pressuring local election officials in key states to find votes to change the outcome of the election. Even 65% of independents are concerned.
- 63% are concerned (with 58% very concerned) about Trump refusing to do anything for over three hours after being told the Capitol was under siege.
- 62% are concerned (with 55% very concerned) about Republican candidate for Governor Kari Lake being a fervent election denier who believes Trump won the 2020 election and threatening to not certify legitimate election results in the future. Even 66% of independents are concerned.

Public Policy Polling surveyed 670 Arizona voters from August 5-6, 2022. The margin of error is +/- 3.8%. 65% of interviews for the survey were conducted by text message and 35% by telephone.

Subject: Strong Support for January 6th Investigation Among Georgia Voters; Georgians See Trump Loyalists as the Problem, Not Just Trump

Date: August 2, 2022

A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that a large majority (76%) of Georgia voters have seen, heard, or read a lot or some about the investigation into what happened on January 6th at the U.S. Capitol, and the events leading up to it. Georgians support the investigation by an 18-point margin (54-36) and a majority (62%) consider the investigation into what happened on January 6th to be important. Among independents, a majority supports the investigation (51-39%) and 55% consider it important.

When considering concerns about the events, nearly half (49%) of voters think the problem was not only with Donald Trump, but also members of the Republican Party who are loyalists to Trump. Just 12% of voters consider Trump to be the only problem. This is also true among independent voters—43% think the problem is also with Trump loyalists in the Republican Party, while just 10% think the problem is only with Trump.

Voters also express major concerns over issues uncovered by the January 6th investigation:

- 65% are concerned (with 52% saying they have very serious concerns, including 50% of independents) about Trump demanding that Mike Pence overturn the election result for him even after White House lawyers told him it was illegal.
- 64% are concerned (with 50% very concerned) about Trump and his allies telling people there was voter fraud in the 2020 election, even after some of Trump's lawyers and the Attorney General told them there was no widespread fraud.
- 60% are concerned (with 52% very concerned) about Trump knowing that many of his supporters attending his rally on January 6th were armed, yet he instructed them to march on the Capitol anyway. Even 54% of independents are concerned.
- 60% are concerned (with 53% very concerned) about Trump refusing to do anything for over three hours after being told the Capitol was under siege.
- 60% are concerned (with 52% very concerned) about Trump and his team repeatedly pressuring local election officials in key states to find votes to change the outcome of the election. Even 53% of independents are concerned.
- 56% are concerned (with 48% very concerned) about Republican Senate candidate Herschel Walker continuing to deny the outcome of the 2020 election and advocating for states like Georgia to re-vote and jail election administrators. Even 55% of independents are concerned.

Public Policy Polling surveyed 517 Georgia voters from July 27-28, 2022. The margin of error is +/- 4.3%. 67% of interviews for the survey were conducted by text message and 33% by telephone.

**Subject: Majority of Michigan Voters Support January 6th Investigation;
Michiganders See Trump Loyalists as the Problem, Not Just Trump**

Date: August 10, 2022

A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that a large majority (82%) of Michigan voters have seen, heard, or read a lot or some about the investigation into what happened on January 6th at the U.S. Capitol and the events leading up to it. A majority (57%) of Michiganders support the investigation and 66% of Michiganders say the January 6th investigation is important to protecting Democracy.

Regarding concerns about the events of January 6th, nearly half (49%) of voters think the problem was not only with Donald Trump, but also with members of the Republican Party who are loyalists to Trump. Just 8% of voters consider Trump to be the only problem. This is also true among independent voters—46% think the problem is also with Trump loyalists in the Republican Party, while just 8% think the problem is only with Trump.

A majority (52%) of Michiganders think Trump and his team who took part in the insurrection on January 6th should be criminally prosecuted, including a plurality of independent voters (48-44). Additionally, 52% say they would be less likely to vote for a candidate for office who downplayed the events of January 6th and opposed the House of Representatives' work in investigating it. Just 16% say they would be more likely to vote for such a candidate.

Voters also express major concerns over issues uncovered by the January 6th investigation:

- 69% are concerned (with 56% saying they have very serious concerns) about Trump demanding that Mike Pence overturn the election result for him even after White House lawyers told him it was illegal. A majority (65%) of independents are concerned and a plurality (48%) have very serious concerns.
- 68% are concerned (with 54% very concerned) about Trump and his allies telling people there was voter fraud in the 2020 election, even after some of Trump's lawyers and the Attorney General told them there was no widespread fraud. Even a majority (59%) of independents are concerned.
- 62% are concerned (with 57% very concerned) about Trump refusing to do anything for over three hours after being told the Capitol was under siege.



- 61% are concerned (with 54% very concerned) about Trump knowing that many of his supporters attending his rally on January 6th were armed yet instructing them to march on the Capitol anyway. Even 55% of independents are concerned.
- 60% are concerned (with 53% very concerned) about Trump and his team repeatedly pressuring local election officials in key states to find the votes to change the outcome of the election. Even 57% of independents are concerned.
- 58% are concerned (with 53% very concerned) about Republican gubernatorial candidate Tudor Dixon insisting that the 2020 election was “stolen” from Donald Trump, without evidence. Even 51% of independents are concerned.

Public Policy Polling surveyed 555 Michigan voters from August 5-6, 2022. The margin of error is +/- 4.2%. 61% of interviews for the survey were conducted by text message and 39% by telephone.

Subject: Majority of Nevada Voters Support January 6th Investigation; Nevadans See Trump Loyalists as the Problem, Not Just Trump

Date: August 2, 2022

A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that a large majority (77%) of Nevada voters have seen, heard, or read a lot or some about the investigation into what happened on January 6th at the U.S. Capitol and the events leading up to it. A majority (51%) of Nevadans support the investigation and a further 50% consider the investigation to be very important when it comes to protecting democracy.

Regarding concerns about the events of January 6th, nearly half (47%) of voters think the problem was not only with Donald Trump, but also with members of the Republican Party who are loyalists to Trump. Just 8% of voters consider Trump to be the only problem. This is also true among independent voters—38% think the problem is also with Trump loyalists in the Republican Party, while just 7% think the problem is only with Trump.

Voters also express major concerns over issues uncovered by the January 6th investigation:

- 62% are concerned (with 51% saying they have very serious concerns) about Trump demanding that Mike Pence overturn the election result for him even after White House lawyers told him it was illegal. A majority (54%) of independents are concerned and a plurality (42%) have very serious concerns.
- 61% are concerned (with 49% very concerned) about Trump and his allies telling people there was voter fraud in the 2020 election, even after some of Trump's lawyers and the Attorney General told them there was no widespread fraud. Even a majority (53%) of independents are concerned.
- 57% are concerned (with 51% very concerned) about Trump refusing to do anything for over three hours after being told the Capitol was under siege.
- 56% are concerned (with 50% very concerned) about Trump knowing that many of his supporters attending his rally on January 6th were armed yet instructing them to march on the Capitol anyway. Even 47% of independents are concerned.
- 56% are concerned (with 50% very concerned) about Trump and his team repeatedly pressuring local election officials in key states to find the votes to change the outcome of the election. Even 47% of independents are concerned.
- 55% are concerned (with 49% very concerned) about Republican Senate candidate Adam Laxalt continuing to deny the outcome of the 2020 election and spreading false conspiracy theories about election fraud.

Public Policy Polling surveyed 508 Nevada voters from July 27-28, 2022. The margin of error is +/- 4.4%. 67% of interviews for the survey were conducted by text message and 33% by telephone.

A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that a large majority (78%) of North Carolina voters have seen, heard, or read a lot or some about the investigation into what happened on January 6th at the U.S. Capitol, and the events leading up to it. North Carolinians support the investigation by a 15-point margin (55-40) and a majority (60%) consider the investigation into what happened on January 6th to be important. Among independents, a majority supports the investigation (58-40%) and 55% consider it important.

When considering concerns about the events, nearly half (47%) of voters think the problem was not only with Donald Trump, but also members of the Republican Party who are loyalists to Trump. Just 11% of voters consider Trump to be the only problem. This is also true among independent voters—49% think the problem is also with Trump loyalists in the Republican Party, while just 3% think the problem is only with Trump.

Voters also express major concerns over issues uncovered by the January 6th investigation:

- 65% are concerned (with 56% saying they have very serious concerns, including 54% of independents) about Trump demanding that Mike Pence overturn the election result for him even after White House lawyers told him it was illegal.
- 64% are concerned (with 52% very concerned) about Trump and his allies telling people there was voter fraud in the 2020 election, even after some of Trump's lawyers and the Attorney General told them there was no widespread fraud.
- 60% are concerned (with 52% very concerned) about Trump knowing that many of his supporters attending his rally on January 6th were armed, yet he instructed them to march on the Capitol anyway. Even 57% of independents are concerned.

Subject: Large Majority of Pennsylvania Voters Are Following the January 6th Investigation And See Trump Loyalists As the Problem, Not Just Trump

Date: June 30, 2022

A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that a large majority (78%) of Pennsylvania voters have seen, heard, or read a lot or some about the investigation by the U.S. House of Representatives into what happened on January 6th and the events leading up to it. Pennsylvanians also show support for the investigation by a 12-point margin (52-40).

A majority (60%) consider the events on January 6th and the effort to overturn elections to be a problem. More than half (51%) of voters consider the problem to not only be Donald Trump, but also members of the Republican Party who are loyalists to Trump. Just 9% of voters consider Trump to be the only problem. This is also true among key independent voters—54% think the problem is also with Trump loyalists in the Republican Party, while just 4% think the problem is only with Trump.

Voters also express major concerns over several issues uncovered by the January 6th investigation and hearings:

- 68% are concerned (with 54% saying they have very serious concerns) about Trump demanding that Mike Pence overturn the election result for him even after White House lawyers told him it was illegal.
- 64% are concerned (with 51% very concerned) about Trump and his allies deciding to tell people there was voter fraud in the 2020 election, even after some of Trump's lawyers and the Attorney General told them there was no widespread fraud.
- 62% are concerned (with 48% very concerned) about Trump using the false claims about the election results to raise hundreds of millions of dollars for his campaigns and businesses.
- 61% are concerned (with 50% very concerned) about Trump and his team repeatedly pressuring local election officials in key states to find the votes needed to change the outcome of the election.
- 61% are concerned (with 47% very concerned) about several of the Republican members of Congress who worked with the Trump team subsequently seeking pardons from the Trump administration because they were worried they had committed crimes.

Public Policy Polling surveyed 582 Pennsylvania voters from June 28-29, 2022. The margin of error is +/- 4.1%. 67% of interviews for the survey were conducted by text message and 33% by telephone.

**Subject: Majority of Wisconsin Voters Support January 6th Investigation;
Wisconsinites See Trump Loyalists as the Problem, Not Just Trump**

Date: August 16, 2022

A new Public Policy Polling survey finds that a large majority (86%) of Wisconsin voters have seen, heard, or read a lot or some about the investigation into what happened on January 6th at the U.S. Capitol and the events leading up to it. A majority (52%) of Wisconsinites support the investigation and 60% say the January 6th investigation is important to protecting Democracy.

Regarding concerns about the events of January 6th, a majority (52%) of voters think the problem was not only with Donald Trump, but also with members of the Republican Party who are loyalists to Trump. Just 7% of voters consider Trump to be the only problem. This is also true among independent voters—56% think the problem is also with Trump loyalists in the Republican Party, while just 7% think the problem is only with Trump.

A majority (51%) of Wisconsinites think Trump and his team who took part in the insurrection on January 6th should be criminally prosecuted, including a majority of independent voters (54%). Additionally, 47% say they would be less likely to vote for a candidate for office who downplayed the events of January 6th and opposed the House of Representatives' work in investigating it. Just 20% say they would be more likely to vote for such a candidate.

Voters also express major concerns over issues uncovered by the January 6th investigation:

- 66% are concerned (with 54% saying they have very serious concerns) about Trump demanding that Mike Pence overturn the election result for him even after White House lawyers told him it was illegal. A majority (66%) of independents are concerned and 57% of independents have very serious concerns.
- 68% are concerned (with 52% very concerned) about Trump and his allies telling people there was voter fraud in the 2020 election, even after some of Trump's lawyers and the Attorney General told them there was no widespread fraud. A majority (51%) of independents are very concerned.
- 61% are concerned (with 54% very concerned) about Trump refusing to do anything for over three hours after being told the Capitol was under siege.



- 61% are concerned (with 54% very concerned) about Trump knowing that many of his supporters attending his rally on January 6th were armed yet instructing them to march on the Capitol anyway. A majority (60%) of independents are concerned.
- 62% are concerned (with 54% very concerned) about Trump and his team repeatedly pressuring local election officials in key states to find the votes to change the outcome of the election. A majority (62%) of independents are concerned.
- 55% are concerned (with 50% very concerned) about Republican Senator Ron Johnson having played an active role in Trump's scheme to overturn the election, and now calling for Wisconsin Republicans to consolidate power over election administration in the state. A majority (57%) of independents are concerned.

Public Policy Polling surveyed 546 Wisconsin voters on August 15, 2022. The margin of error is +/- 4.2%. 67% of interviews for the survey were conducted by text message and 33% by telephone.
